# **PROFILE OF THE UNIVERSITY**

## **GENESIS**

Maharaja Agrasen University (MAU) derives its name from Maharaja Agrasen, born during the last stages of Dwapar Yuga in the Mahabharata Epic Era, the philanthropist who established the Kingdom of Agroha, near Hissar in Haryana, about 5100 years ago. His monarchy consisted of 18 units. The head of each unit was given a specific 'Gotra'. Equality, Humanism and Non-Violence were the guiding principles of his kingdom. He promulgated that any immigrant coming to settle down at Agroha must be given a brick and a rupee by each resident. Thus, the new settler would have a hundred thousand bricks to build a house for him-self, and a hundred thousand rupees to start his business. This way, with a small help from the society, all citizens could attain equal status in a community of equals. The Government of India issued a postage stamp in 1976 to commemorate the 5100<sup>th</sup> Jayanti of Maharaja Agrasen.

## **SPONSORING BODY**

Maharaja Agrasen Technical Education Society (MATES)- the sponsoring body of the university- is a charitable non-profit organization, established in 1998 and registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860, with the objective to establish institutions of higher education, particularly in the field of technical and professional education of international standards. Its mission is to train the youth to become high class global professionals infused with our traditional, ethical and moral values. In pursuance of the said objective, MATES established Maharaja Agrasen University in the year 2012.

## **LEGAL STATUS**

Maharaja Agrasen University is a private university u/s 2(f) of the University Grant Commission (UGC) Act, 1956 and established under The Maharaja Agrasen University (Establishment & Regulations) Act, 2012 (Act No.15 of 2013), passed by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Himachal Pradesh, received the assent of Hon'ble Governor on 5<sup>th</sup> January, 2013 and deemed to have come into effect w.e.f. 16<sup>th</sup> July, 2012. The University was inaugurated by His Excellency Shri Pranab Mukharjee, Hon'ble President of India on 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2013. The academic activities of the University started in August 2013.

The University is situated in the picturesque backdrop of Kasauli Hills, Himachal Pradesh. The University has been allotted 51227.64 sq. mt. land by HIMUDA vide letter no. HIMUDA/Education Hub (Plot No. 6 & 8)/07-Admn dated 04-03-08. There are 8 Academic Blocks, one Administrative Block, each having four storeys, besides an Auditorium, Amphitheatre, etc. Ramps and lifts have been provided for Physically Challenged Persons. The green area covers more than 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of the total land.

In a short span of 5 years, after commencement of the teaching session on 01 August 2013, MAU has marked its presence as the most innovative and research driven university in Management, Engineering, Applied Sciences, Humanities, Law and Architecture not only in Himachal Pradesh but in the neighboring states as well, and attracts students from throughout India thus acquiring a Pan-Indian status.

The objective of the university is to enable each and every student to develop self-confidence, self-knowledge and self-control. The university promises to equip all students with knowledge and talent to lead their lives in a righteous and conscientious manner. It offers an atmosphere for the development of individual student with enriched virtues and noble ideals.
